Students will be required to log onto Google Meet at their allocated lesson time slot for the normal lesson that they have scheduled. Failure to log on and submit work will result in contact home.

Tutor time expectations

- Teachers will check in with their tutees, discussing the day ahead and any issues arising.

- Lessons will be delivered for a period between 20 and 45 minutes using Google Meet
- Assignments will be set using <u>Google Classroom</u>
- The same timetable will be followed to ensure that all students are able to access their full curriculum provision.

- If students demonstrate any poor behaviour or conduct whilst using online classrooms, the teacher will remove them from the classroom for that lesson and inform parents as soon as possible.

Overview of Google Classroom & Google Meet

- Google Meet is an online video conferencing (like Skype or FaceTime) where a teacher can also share their desktop.
- Google Classroom is an online space where documents, slides and sheets and pre recorded teacher explanation can be shared with students, once specifically invited to the Classroom. The students can use the uploaded content and any resources to complete assignments set by their teachers.
- All students have been set regular homework on Google Classroom, so understand how to use this. Alongside this all students in Key Stage 3 (Years 7 9) have had a 3 lesson introduction/ re-familiarisation with how to use Google Classroom in their Computer Science lessons and a tutor time session.
- Once submitted, work will be individually marked or class feedback provided.

• Attendance to sessions will be captured based on these submissions

Live lesson code of conduct


- Google Meet should only be used during timetabled classes.
- Google Meet lessons have the same standards and expectations as a normal lesson. Teachers will verbally remind students of expectations in terms of language, behaviour and expectations.
- The class should always have two or more students.
- Students must turn off their cameras unless they are able to blur their background.
- Teachers will direct students to turn off their microphones, unless the teacher wants to encourage student questions.
- If a teacher believes that something untoward is happening e.g. someone else in the background recording the Google Meet, then the lesson should be terminated immediately and the incident reported to their line manager.
- If an incident with a student occurs in a lesson, the teacher will mute or remove the student from the lesson and report this incident in the normal way in line with standard academy procedure.
- Any safeguarding issues encountered will be reported in line with the school's safeguarding policy.




Google Classroom

This guide is a reminder of how to access Google Meet and Google Classroom(s).




- Go to https://classroom.google.com in your web browser
- Select the + icon in the top right hand corner of the page
- Note: if this is your first time using Classroom you will need to select 'Student'




- Select the Join button next to the class that you wish to open or select an existing class




How do I join my virtual lessons?

All your lessons can be joined by using Google Meet.


On your computer or laptop.

- 1. Login to your school Google Classroom
- 2. Press the waffle (the nine dots) in the top right corner
- 3. Look in the list for the Meet app and click






4. Your next lesson will be at the top of the list. Remember to check the times.




5. Click on your lesson to join. You should see your face if you have a camera.
